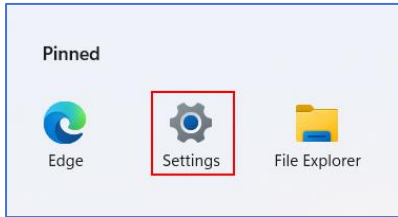


Windows system to change the language Steps

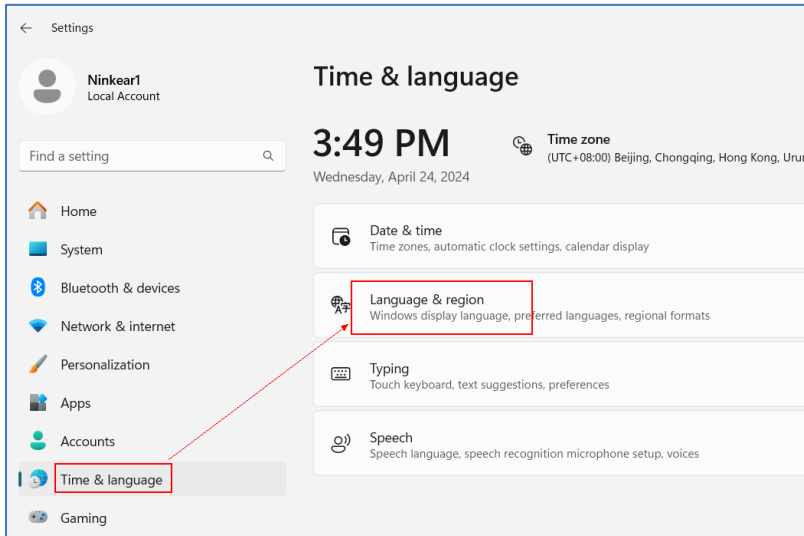
Method one:

If you can't fully switch the language of all interfaces in method one, try using method two.

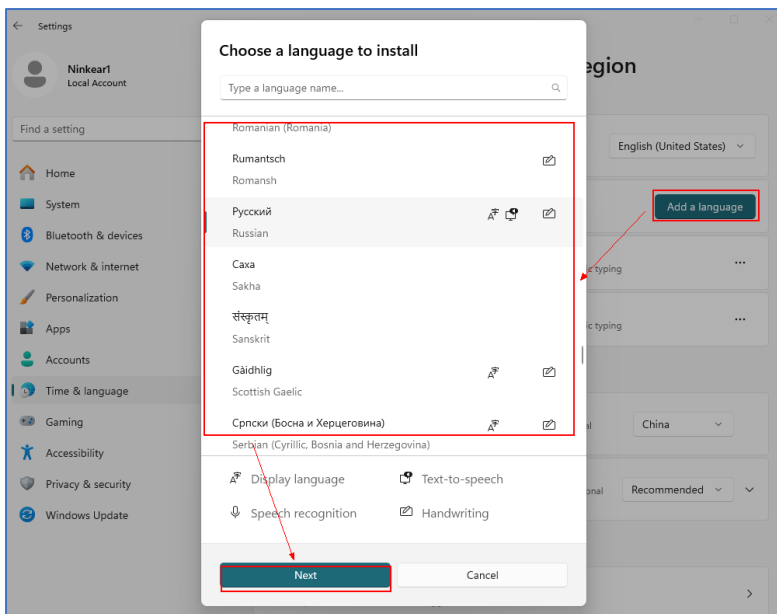
1. Open the [Settings] interface



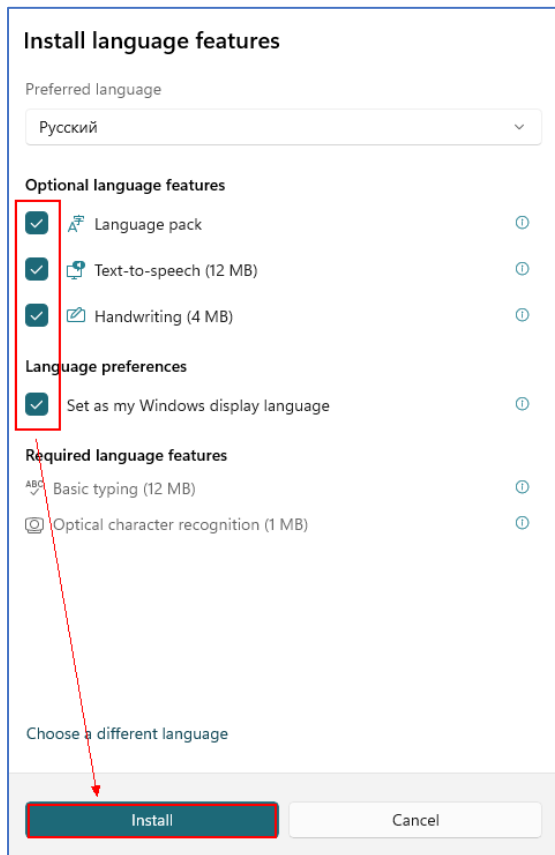
2. Click [Time and Language], and then click [Language and Region] on the right.



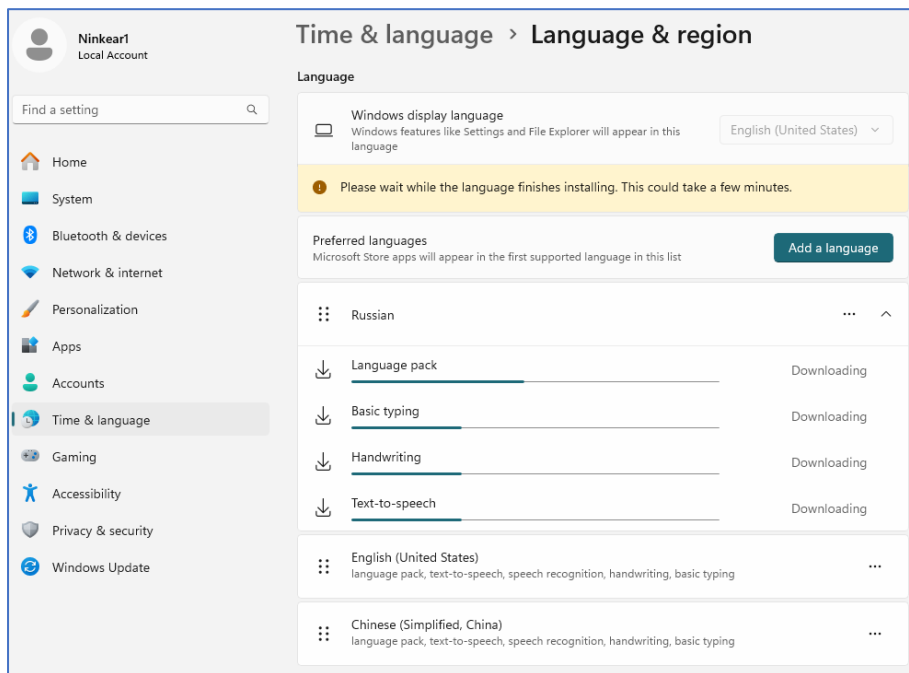
3. Click [Add Language], select the corresponding language, and then click [Next].



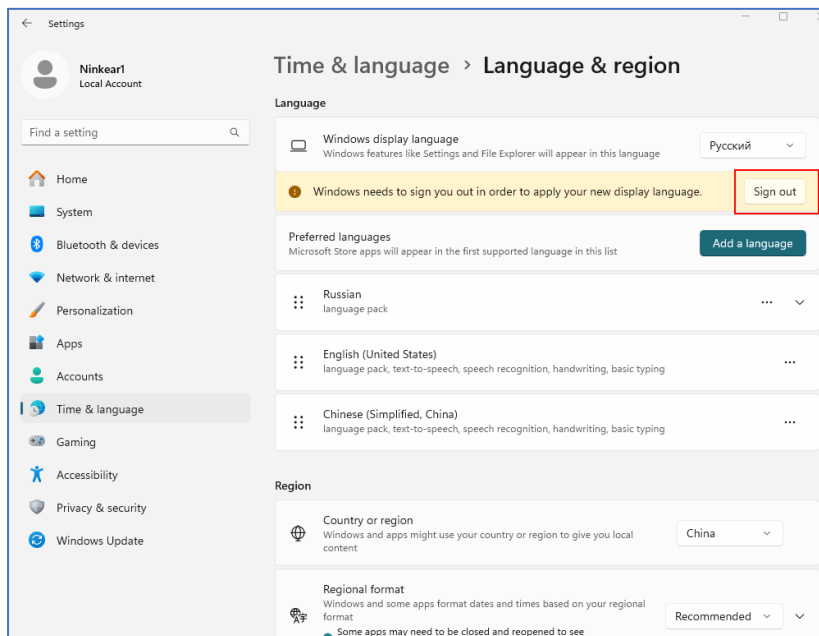
4. Wait for the language file to download.



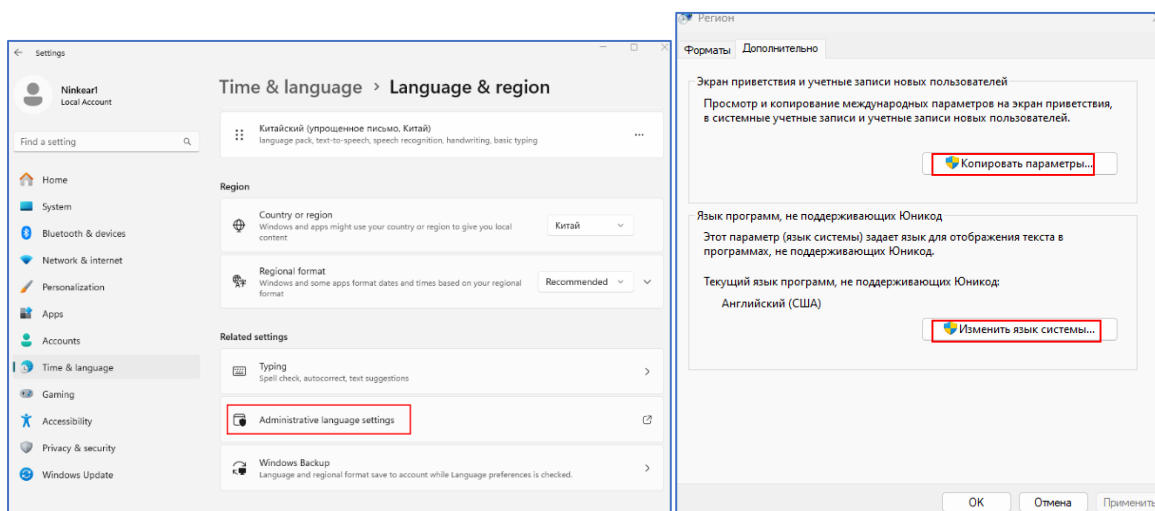
5. When the download is complete, click the [Logout] button.



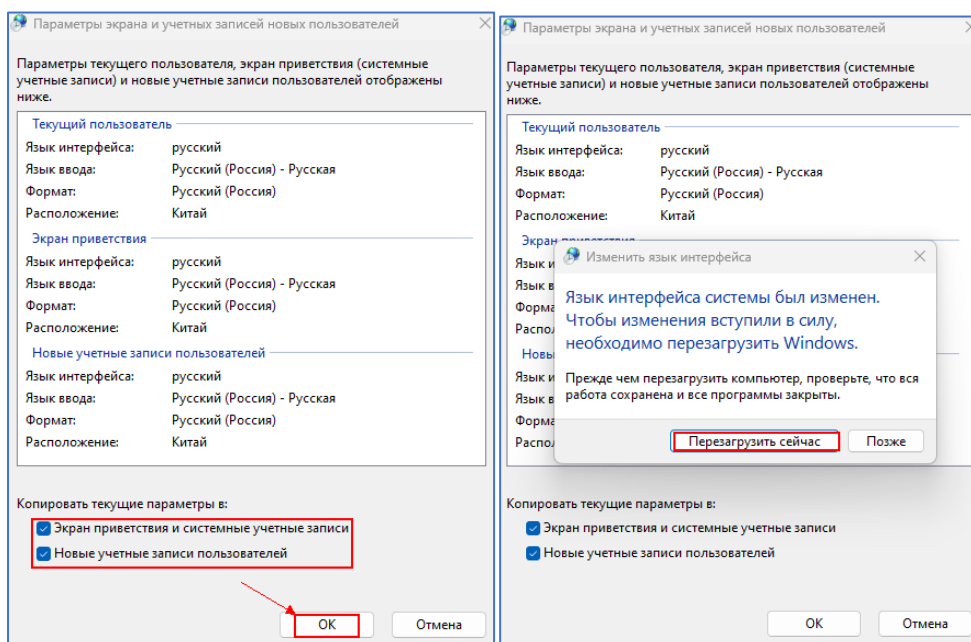
6. After logging in again, go to the [Languages and Regions] screen, click [Manage Language Settings].



7. Click [Copy Settings].



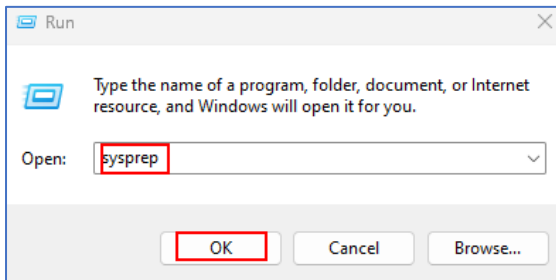
8. Tick [Restore Screen and System Accounts] and [New User Account], and then click [Confirm] button;



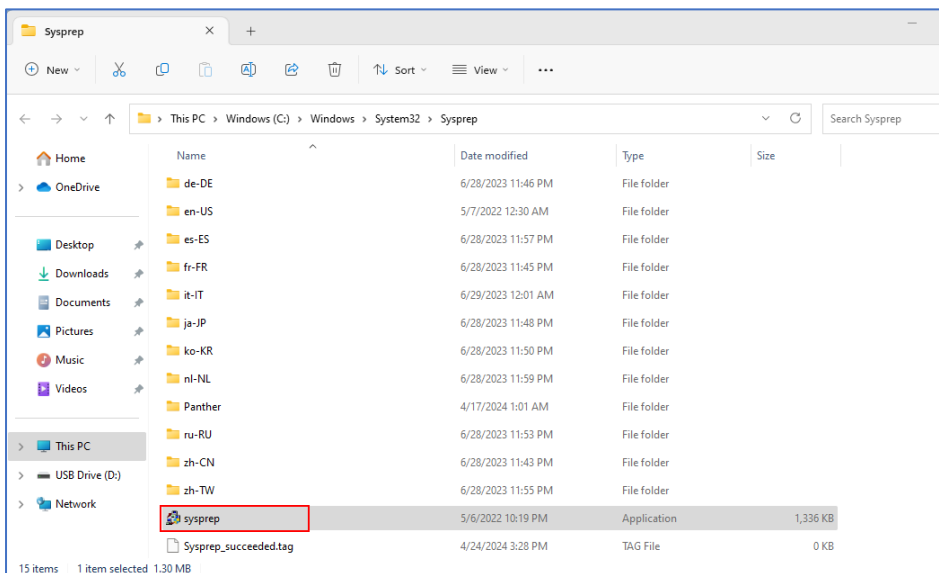
9. Finally click Restart, wait for the restart to complete, and then enter Windows again to switch to the corresponding language;

Method two:

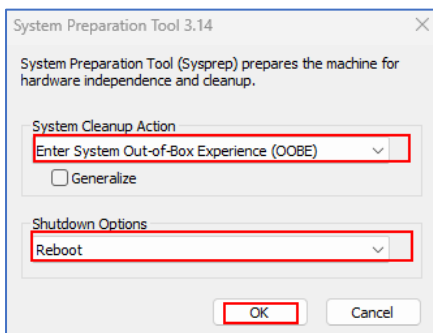
Press Windows+R to bring up the Run input box, type sysprep, Click “OK”



in the open folder, double-click to run the sysprep.exe programme,



click the Confirm button in the pop-up window to re-package the system;



After restarting, you will automatically enter the language selection interface; (This method requires you to re-create your account, if you have pending Windows updates, this process will report an error, please complete the Windows patch update first;)
